All of our interns come from San Juan Clinic in Lima and are studying in two universities, Inca Garcilaso de la Vega and Alas Peruanas. They also have studied the basic courses in speech and language therapy, so they are able to help the patients in these areas, for which we have adapted a small space in the Rehabilitation Center.

In May, three members of our Support Group for Special Needs People in San Miguel attended the annual Municipality workshop, "Participated Town Budget 2016," in which needy organizations draw up their projects to be presented to the mayor and council for approval. As this article is being written, the project that we have presented has been approved: the construction of two public bathrooms. The construction of the ramp, which has been detained due to the rains, will be built at the same time. As our new mayor begins his term of office, a few of the streets of San Miguel are being asphalted, thus allowing easier access for our patients.

As we continue our everyday activities, we are eagerly awaiting the month of October, when we shall celebrate the Golden Jubilee of Santa Angela Merici School and of the gift of our Ursuline presence in Peru.
