Sacred Heart Schools' Heritage Room Timeline

After two years of committee work, the Sacred Heart Schools' Heritage Room timeline was installed in the Motherhouse in October, 2022. The timeline tells the story of the founding of Sacred Heart Schools by the Louisville Ursulines in 1858 to the present day. The committee included Sacred Heart Schools alumna and staff, and Sisters Janet Peterworth, Judy Rice and Martha Jacob. Committee members also included Archivist Laurel Wilson, who worked on photo selection, copy and captions; and Director of Communications Kathy Williams, who designed the timeline and managed production.
